Access to Work

Access to Work can help you get or stay in work if you have a physical or mental health condition or disability.

Support for Paid Work

Access to Work can provide you with the support to need to be in <u>paid work</u>, including selfemployment and working from home. Access to Work does not provide support for volunteers.

An Access to Work grant can help pay for things like:

- specialist equipment and assistive software.
- o support workers, like a BSL interpreter, a job coach or a travel buddy.
- o costs of travelling to work, if you cannot use public transport.
- o adaptations to your vehicle so you can get to work.
- physical changes to your workplace.

Support is not means tested and the minimum number of hours you need to work is just one hour per week.

As part of Access to Work, you may be eligible for:

- o a grant to help pay for practical support with your work,
- o support with managing your mental health at work.

For these types of support, you must:

- have a physical or mental health condition or disability that means you need support to do your job or get to and from work,
- o be 16 or over,
- o be in paid work (or be about to start or return to paid work in the next 12 weeks).

Eligibility

You must have a disability, illness or health condition that means you need support to do your job. This can include, for example:

- o a physical disability, for example if you're hard of hearing or use a wheelchair
- o a learning disability or related condition, for example if you have Down's syndrome
- o a developmental condition, like autism spectrum disorder
- o learning difficulties or differences like ADHD or dyslexia
- o an illness such as diabetes or epilepsy
- o a temporary condition, like a broken leg
- o a mental health condition, for example anxiety or depression
- You do not need to be diagnosed with a condition to apply.
