Well, after a fairly stagnant 2021 due to Covid, our work experience department has certainly made up for it this year! We've been working flat out over the last couple of months, particularly because a lot of our learners are due to finish their current r



learners are due to finish their current programme.

At the time of writing, 95% of our learners have arranged work experience, many with potential to result in paid employment, or long term meaningful activity.

Having made several new and exciting business connections over the last 12 months, some of the employers include Golf Catcher, Wickes, AutoLynx Garage, holiday clubs and nurseries.



One of our newest Partners, Lush, not only held a fantastic workshop at Boscome (see update from Kerry), but will also be taking on two learners for work experience in their Bournemouth and Poole stores. This ranges from 20 hours per week for three weeks to every Friday ongoing.

The Radipole Lake Café is now up and running and the learners there have already hosted an amazing soft launch following some rehearsal lunches with staff. Come and join us for a cuppa! :)

We also worked with BCP to launch the Project Search Assessment day, It was a huge success with five of our young people being confirmed for placement starting in September 😂 .

We will continue to make more connections in the local community which will develop into some exciting educational and work experience opportunities which we can share in the next newsletter.

We've also been looking at work experience and college for many of our learners, with around 30 due to move on in July. We are hoping these will develop into employment, college and apprenticeships while a handful will be staying with SWRAC to complete a traineeship.

The purpose was to acknowledge that some people have deep sensory needs and they wanted to get our learner feedback and participation on soaps, slimes and other products and the textures and smells.

Everyone from the whole centre got involved making some cosmetics.

It's not often groups from


different programmes get to do something together, so it was nice and worked very well.

Finally, we've been given a weekly slot on Hot Radio sharing a joke of the week. Here are a couple of out favourites. Listen out for us every Friday.


SWRAC STAFF GETS PUBLISHED!

THRIVE OFFICIALLY IN DORCHESTER

Following the launch of this fantastic programme in September 2020, we are delighted to announce that our first two learners are 'graduating' THRIVE. The 19and-23-year-olds will be transitioning to Prep to Work over in Boscombe and have already started to prepare, learning construction skills and using these to build a bug hotel and bird box.

Over in Dorchester, we have welcomed our first THRIVE learner now that the self-contained flat is up and running and expect to have more join us in September.



As part of the programme overall, catering is a big focus and we've been getting the learners to put on regular cream teas for staff, parents and carers to prepare for conference catering. The guys have been working incredibly

hard on all aspects including food preparation and service and are now confident they'll soon be able to cater for conferences for 100 people. Just brilliant!

Now that Covid restrictions have fully lifted, we've ramped up our gym project. This involves the learners going to The Junction in Broadstone, buying themselves entry and following a workout plan with individual goals. They pair up and have to work together, which has been amazing for social skills. We have been enjoying lunch in the café afterwards too and one learner has even secured work experience for when they leave in November.

Finally, we have an exciting partnership with AFC Bournemouth which will teach the learners football skills as well as tailored workshops covering topics such as equality, diversity and racism.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Promoting good physical and mental wellbeing has been a focus at SWRAC for some time now and Samir in Boscombe and Archie in Dorchester are continuously experimenting with new sessions.

In Boscombe, the success of our Tuesday night football has led to our learners being signposted to an external team with Ability Counts, which is part of AFC Bournemouth community <u>sports trust</u>. This is great news as it encourages them to develop new social and team skills with peers outside of SWRAC.

One of the participants has also secured part time work, with <u>Mini Soccer Advance</u>, a local football project for children. So, some excellent community work going on.

Tennis sessions are now being held and other activities have included bowling, virtual reality centres and a trip to the New Forest.

A Yoga pilot is also being trialled and we've had 4 sessions so far which have all been well received and completely transformed peoples' perspective of this form of exercise.

In Dorchester, the Health and Wellbeing sessions continue to have an outdoorsy focus. Den building, walks at Weymouth beach and Thorncombe Woods have all been regulars on the agenda as well as visits to a local art gallery and pottery exhibition.

We've been asking the learners to come up with some of their own ideas so we can encourage them to share in each other's hobbies and one session that went down extremely well was fossil hunting.

The sessions, which started at the beginning of this academic year, have been great for improving confidence and getting in some physical activity outside of the main curriculum.

"When I came to SWRAC, I wasn't doing great and was in a pretty bad way. I just didn't like the way they taught and it was very repetitive. Here, it's been a really good balance of practical and written work with a chance to go out and have fun and play sport too. That really gets my mind in gear.

"It's such a nice place to be and the staff have been so supportive and there for you if you need to get something off your chest. I'm going to miss them 100% but I'm excited to go off to Weymouth College.

"I completed a uniformed services, construction and animal care unit at SWRAC animal care is probably my favourite as I am an animal lover and like being outdoors - but I am also really into tech and computers, so this course seemed good. I'm doing a level 2, but hopefully can go on to do a level 3 after that."
