Reference - HEALTH AND SAFETY AT WORK ACT 1974

It is SWRAC's policy to ensure the Health and Safety and welfare of all employees, candidates, students, and members of the general public insofar as they are affected by SWRAC's activities, as far as is reasonably practicable.

SWRAC shall put in place such mechanisms that can be used to report any unsafe (either potential or real) conditions and shall take such steps as necessary to remediate such occurrences.

SWRAC shall review this policy at least biennially and any changes shall be notified in writing.
